case file. Since the Department of Corrections and the probationer will already have copies, additional copies would not normally be

required to be sent.

If the court is granting judgment for unpaid restitution or unpaid financial obligations, the original is filed in the criminal case file. The Clerk is required to docket the judgment without fee. Notice of entry of judgment must be sent to the judgment creditor and debtor as

with any civil judgment.
